

Postgraduate Programme Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Public Health
Heinrich-Heine-University, Duesseldorf
(accredited by AQAS)

The Postgraduate Training Programme “Master of Science” (M.Sc.) in Public Health aims at qualifying experts in the health sector to identify and analyse important health needs at the level of population groups, and to develop and implement practical solutions towards improving population health.

This programme continues and advances a curriculum of Public Health established in 1991 which has been successfully completed by more than 200 students.

The training programme can be completed alongside a full-time job.

Degree

- The programme provides scientific and practical skills in core fields of public health. At completion, students will be given the degree “Master of Science” (M.Sc.) in Public Health by the University of Düsseldorf.

Entry Requirements

- Students must have a university degree or a state examination or a master or bachelor degree in one of the following disciplines: medicine, dental health, basic sciences with documented links to medicine, economic, social, behavioural or life sciences with documented expertise in at least one core area of public health.
- Students must have at least one year of professional work experience in the health sector; alternatively they have to demonstrate qualified scientific activity in the field of medicine or public health.
- Students must have fluent command of German (DSH1-Examination, TestDaF) and English.

Start of the training programme

The programme starts every year in the winter semester.

Deadline for application

Applications must be sent by **June 15** of the same year.

Workload, progression through the programme

According to international regulation, a workload of 1800 hours (60 ECTS credits) is required. Single courses of 2 to 6 days are offered, in part on working days and on weekends. In addition, structured home work is required. The full programme can be completed within 2 years. If necessary, students can extend this for an additional 2 years, for a total of 4 years. The programme must be completed within 4 years.

Structure of the curriculum

The programme contains an introductory, an in-depth and a specialization phase. Students can specialize either in “epidemiology and prevention” or in “health management and financing”.

Courses are combined into 10 modules that end with an examination. In the specialization phase, students also work on their master’s thesis. Course language is mainly German, with an increasing number of courses thought in English.

Cooperation

Parts of the programme are offered together with the programme “Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Epidemiology” offered at the Heinrich-Heine-University in cooperation with the Universities of Mainz and Bielefeld. In addition, some courses are offered jointly with the Programme of Public Health Doctors in cooperation with the Academy of Public Health, Duesseldorf.
